WIOSAP Project progress report highlights

- a) Key activities: PSC actions, Supporting of COP Decisions, Capacity Building on MSP, Project Implementation Task forces and Committees, Key project guidelines
- b) Activities delivered under each project component and outcomes
- Demonstration project s approved under each component and those demonstration projects whose concepts have been approved but are still under development.
- d) Sustainability of WIOSAP through supportive projects

Outcomes:

- a) PMU was requested to support domestication of guidelines at national level to ensure their application in management
- b) PSC acknowledged the progress made in the implementation of WIOSAP project and adopted the progress report.

Outcomes

- a) PMU was requested to provide detail on budget under the headings used in internal reporting: Personnel, Travel. Consultancies, Contractors and implementing partners to support PSC in making informed decision
- b) Approval deferred until further detail on the budget is provided by PMU



Development of Demo Projects

- d) Support to countries requiring additional technical input which PMU was requested to provide.

Outcomes

- a) PMU requested to continue seeking approval from PSC virtually where necessary to ensure speedy project delivery.
- b) Deadlines of submission of proposals for second round of proposal is 15 July 2019
- c) Need to ensure equity in distribution of demo projects among the WIO countries. Each country should have at least 1 demo project.
