Policy and Institutional Framework

Policy Decision:

- ▶ Need for a high-level policy decision for implementation of MSP (e.g. Cabinet/Parliamentary level) as well as including: need strong political commitments
- ▶ clear goals and objectives and
- ▶ Policies supporting MSP (e.g. Djibouti)

Institutional Reform/Arrangement:

- **Legal mandate and authority** :Institute responsible for MSP
- **Effective and coordinated MSP** in the area (avoidance of sector-based approaches);
- Establishment up of **inter-sectoral committees**: these committees can serve to steer the process, sharing of information, implementation and monitoring

Capacity Building

- ▶ Funding support
- ▶ Expertise/ technical capacity
- ▶ Regional partnerships (to facilitate MSP as a collective responsibility)
- ▶ Adopt appropriate approach to MSP
- ▶ Support institutional reforms / a framework will trigger institutional reforms and policy harmonization
- ▶ **Data Management**
 - Develop agreements or guidelines for data sharing
 - Regional online portal
 - Engage with community/traditional knowledge
 - Support Deep sea data collection projects
 - Transparency and access to information/data
- ▶ **Transboundary MSP**
 - Support for countries to conduct joint MSP
 - Support common area management

Way Forward: Roadmap

1. Develop Regional MSP strategy & guideline

- a) Establish a regional MSP technical working group
- b) Conduct regional and national legal/policy gap analysis
- c) Countries in the WIO region are in different level in terms of MSP practice

2. Funding and Partnership/Collaboration

- a) Stock taking (mapping who is doing what) and
- b) Build partnership for leveraging resources and effective use

3. Capacity building

- a) National governments(financial, technical and material support)
- b) Communities & stakeholders engagement
- c) GIS and spatial analysis
- d) Strengthen national data centers
- e) Data Management: determine key data layers needed for national and transboundary/regional MSP
