#### 1. Overview of the Indian Ocean Commission

- Intergovernmental organisation for regional cooperation
- Founded in 1982 and formalised in 1984
- Comprising solely of island (Comoros, Madagascar, Mauritius, Seychelles and Reunion Island of France)
- Govern by the Council of Ministers
- Secretariat : Located in Mauritius
   Head by a Secretary General



### **Partnership Agreements**

- Observer Status at the United Nations
- MOU with Nairobi Convention
- MoU with IMO
  - In the process of signing a specific MoU with IMO for the Glofouling Project.
- Discussing partnership agreement with UNDP for a programme on Chemicals and Hazardous Waste

- Advocate at regional and international level

- Strengthen capacity

#### **SUBSIDIARITY**

- Respect the sovereignty of each member state

## **Strategic Framework & Areas of Intervention**

#### Peace and Stability

Cooperation to promote peace ,good governance, maritime safety and security, combat transboundary crimes

#### Economic development

Cooperation to promote economic growth, participation of the private sector, ensure food security, responsible fisheries development, sustainable blue economy

#### Environment and Climate Change

Cooperation to protect, conserve management and utilisation of biodiversity; 'climate change and disaster risk reduction to reduce losses and build resilience

#### Human Development

Cooperation in education, research and innovation, health, gender, culture and mass communication

ii. Regional Agreement to collaborate on maritime operations (Operation Centre established in Seychelles)

2010-2012 ESA-IO Regional Agreement for preparedness for and response to Marine pollution. RCC recommended for South Africa
