












Recent developments in transboundary initiatives







- Spatial management strategy to protect ecosystems and ecological processes that transcend national jurisdictions
- 2015 IUCN WCPA guidelines TBCA typology
 - Transboundary protected area
 - Transboundary conservation landscape **Mixed** and/or seascape
 - Transboundary migration conservation area Mixed
 - Park for Peace (special designation)

How to consider these guidelines/ typologies for the Kenya-Tanzania TBCA?












Figure 3: Diagrammatic representation of a Transboundary Conservation Landscape/Seascape





General recommendations









To facilitate the development of the Kenya - Tanzania TBCA

Technical recommendations

- Support the conservation planning exercises by endorsing the planning process at all government levels, providing all the relevant data needed, actively participating in the workshops, and responding to communications and requests in a timely manner
- Commit to achieving consensus when identifying the conservation and management objectives (e.g., biodiversity, conservation, fisheries) to be considered in the planning exercises

Policy recommendations

- Commit to carefully consider the suggested conservation plans, and will collectively and cooperatively decide on the best scenario to adopt for implementation
- Support the development of the necessary policy frameworks and institutional arrangements, based on the agreed upon conservation plan
