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Why the Project



- Objective: Towards supporting regional & national actions to address stresses on marine and coastal water quality (linked to Decision CP.9/7):
 - Prepare Situation Assessment of Marine & Coastal Water Quality Management (C&MWQM) in WIO region
 - Develop Strategic Framework for C&MWQM for WIO region to harmonize monitoring and management, including regional quality guidelines
 - Prepared Policy Brief
 - Conduct Training Course on C&MWQM for a selection of countries
- Where: WIO region







Key Achievements

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Informed by Situation Assessment, Strategic Framework for C&MWQM for WIO region adopted at COP11 (Aug 2024)

Guidelines to set Water and Sediment Quality Targets in WIO region adopted at COP11 (Aug 2024)

- Prepared Training Course Material to support National Implementation of C&MWQM
- CSIR successfully completed training for Madagascar, Kenya, Seychelles, South Africa, Tanzania & Zanzibar (March 2024)
- Output: Draft National C&MWQM Frameworks for participating countries! (June 2024)

Key Lessons Learnt

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- Critical to actively engage and collaborate with national specialists (researchers, managers, policy makers) in developing management tools early on to capitalize on place-based knowledge and to be able to address country-level challenges
- Practical, 'learning-by-doing' training of dedicated national representatives active in C&MWQM is key to initiating country-level implementation (assisting with taking 'science-to-policy-to-practice')
- Joint training sessions (multi-countries) is a useful approach to facilitate sharing of learning among WIO countries ('challenges and successes are seldom unique')







Project Sustainability

Coastal and Marine WQ Management (C&MWQM) **NOT a 'once-off' exercise**, future sustainability requires:

- Dedicated regional institutional structure to facilitate regional harmonization and coordination C&MWQM (i.e. Regional Coastal & Marine WQ Task Force), guided by Regional C&MWQM Framework
- Dedicated national institutional structures committed to country-level planning & implementation guided by a National C&MWQM Framework, embedded in national policy and legislation
- Dedicated (e.g. annual) regional training & capacity development workshops for continuous support, sharing and learning among countries, coordinated through
 Nairobi Convention Secretariat in consultation with Regional Coastal and Marine WQ Task Force
