Concept Note

I. Introduction

The Contracting Parties to the Nairobi Convention are implementing the FFEM / OFB funded project on "Integrated Management of the Marine and Coastal Resources of the Northern Mozambique Channel" (NOCAMO). The NOCAMO project is supporting various interventions across the region to address scenarios for development to maximize the opportunities for sustainable development in the Northern Mozambique Channel (NMC), based on preservation of the health of marine ecosystems as a foundation for future prosperity. In this regard, the project uses the holistic approach for Integrated Ocean Management and will assist the countries in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, in particular Goal 14 on conservation and sustainable use of the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development.

The project covers the Northern Mozambique Channel (NMC) and the beneficiaries of the project are Tanzania, Mozambique, Madagascar and Comoros.

A first Partner meeting was held on February 15th, 2023 after a long period of very low activity due to the COVID-19 pandemic and because of the fact that a regional coordinating support was still expected for the project.

Project goal

By 2030, the Northern Mozambique Channel's high biodiversity value coral reef and associated ecosystems are maintained and enhanced through effective spatial management of marine uses, in particular the oil and gas sector, to secure a sustainable future for coastal communities and economies.

Since the first partner meeting held in February 2023, three follow-up meetings with the partners and donors have been conducted on April 5th 2023, May 11th 2023, and June 23rd 2023, respectively. During the Marine Region Forum, were also held a technical dialogue with the NCS national focal points, on 6th of November 2023, and a side event on the 9th of November 2023.

Specific objectives of the NOCAMO project

Component 1 • By 2026, the institutional and knowledge foundations are laid for the application of multi-stakeholder based Marine Spatial Planning (MSP) across the NMC region;

Component 2 • By 2026, effective planning is promoted and best practices in the Oil and Gas sector are adopted by Governments and private sector champions, leading to mitigation of impacts of the sector to the biodiversity and ecosystem services in the NMC;

Component 3 • By 2026, community livelihoods and well-being are incrementally secured through the sharing and replication of best practices in community-based marine resource management.

Some activities included under the three components have already been funded by co-financing, so work has been able to proceed despite the delayed official inception of the project.

Importantly, several synergies with other regional projects of the Nairobi Convention exist, with the NOCAMO Project contributing to the overall resources available and subsequent impact that can be achieved in the four beneficiary countries.

Some common themes shared with other projects include:

- Marine Spatial Planning, which is common to WIOSAP, ACP MEAs (Africa, Caribbean and Pacific multilateral Environmental Agreements), SWIOFC Partnership project (Southwest Indian Ocean Fisheries Commission) and SAPPHIRE
- Data and Information Management, common to WIOSAP, SWIOFC Partnership project and SAPPHIRE
- Valuation of ecosystem services, common to WIOSAP, SWIOFC Partnership project and SAPPHIRE
- Science to Policy Interface, common to WIOSAP, SWIOFC Partnership project, ACP MEAs and SAPPHIRE
- Ocean Governance and Blue Economy, common to WIOSAP, SWIOFC Partnership project, ACP MEAs and SAPPHIRE
- **Coordination**, common to WIOSAP, SWIOFC Partnership project, ACP MEAs and SAPPHIRE

Project Steering Committee responsibilities

In general, the Steering Committee for the NOCAMO projecthas the following responsibilities:

- Provide guidance, as well as overall strategic policy and management direction to the project;
- Annually review and assess the progress of the project
- Discuss and review draft strategies for improving sustainability of environmental benefits and replication drafted by the project unit;
- Monitoring and reviewing of co-financing delivered to the project in line with the donors' requirements;
- Annually review and approve revised work plan and budgets
- Advice on appropriate mechanisms for interaction with the private sector;
- Seek additional funding to support the outputs and activities of the NOCAMO project;

- Review the quality of deliverables produced
