


Nairobi Convention Work on ABNJ

Area Based Planning



- Area-based planning is a process through which resource management spatial regulations are designed
- Spatial planning allows activities competing for the same space to be managed reducing risks and supporting sustainable use



---Support - Sustainable fisheries management and biodiversity conservation of deep-sea living marine resources and ecosystems in the areas beyond national jurisdiction by the Food and Agriculture Organization & UNEP

To urge Contracting Parties to cooperate in improving the governance of areas beyond national jurisdiction, building on existing regional institutions including the Nairobi Convention and developing area based management tools such as marine spatial planning to promote the blue

Area Based Planning tools meeting organized by Nairobi Convention and UNEP-WCMC (September 2016, Seychelles)


> Outcomes:

- Countries agree on the need for integrated management of areas within and those beyond national jurisdiction (EEZ & ABNJ) due to issues of interconectivity and migratory species
- > Countries called upon Nairobi Convention to support ABNJ management e.g by
 - Capacity building
 - Awareness creation



EBSA Identified for Southern Indian Ocean Region








Seamounts in the Western Indian Ocean region





- Approximately 700 seamounts identified in WIO region
- Seamounts are often targeted buy fishing vessels
- Enhanced Primary productivity:
 - Attracts seabirds
 - Creates suitable breeding ground for pelagic species
 - Provides feeding ground for demersal species

- Gather share experiences from regional ABNJ area-based planning

- Blue Economy
