




The inception meeting was held on 27 July 2022.

- Where systems are already available these tools will be used- COASTAL VIEWER
- Will undertake a review and assessment of the existing decision support tools that can be useful to this project, and such tools exist, recommendations will be made to both DFFE and BCC on the implications of developing another system together with its requirements (hosting, licenses, platform and environment including staff requirement).
